



- Position:** Day Camp Internship
- Days/Hours:** 120 hours + 16 hours training.
Training will be scheduled second week of June. Program hours to be completed last week of June - Early September. Mon-Fri 40hrs/wk – requirement for internship. (30 hours hand-on 10 hours planning/support each week)
- Purpose:** Facilitate outdoor recreation activities and adaptive techniques in a Day Camp setting for children with and without disabilities, ages 5 – 21 and varying disabilities.
- Supervisor:** Day Camp Manager/Director

Responsibilities:

- Delivery high quality programs through the utilization of techniques and expertise in child behavior, outdoor recreation and adaptive techniques (training provided).
- Provide excellent customer service through communication with parents, caregivers, staff and volunteers on a daily basis, including pre and post event communication loops.
- Coach participants with and without disabilities (ages 5 – 21) through sometimes challenging programs and social environments.
- Problem solve any logistical glitches that may come up during Day Camp
- Drive Outdoors for All vehicles with participants and/or equipment
- Attend and help facilitate all required training
- Load, unload, clean and operate recreational equipment as needed for the program
- Ensure that paperwork in regards to attendance, bus logs and Outdoors for All reporting policies is being accurately completed and turned in by seasonal staff and volunteers.
- Report program and participant successes and concerns to the Program Manager/Director.
- Work with Day Camp Staff in the supervision and direction of day camp volunteers.
- Set-up alternative activities and deliver for Day Camp as needed
- Assist Program Manager in daily, weekly and monthly program plans and communication as needed.

Qualifications:

- Knowledge of disabilities, recreational activities and adaptive techniques and/or willingness to complete training
- Current Washington State Drivers License
- Current CPR and First Aid
- Ability to lift 50lbs
- Pro-active leadership and communication skills
- Ability to give and receive feedback in a positive manner
- Commitment to all responsibilities and expectations.

Compensation: Internships with Outdoors for All are not paid, but offer a great deal of hands on experience. College credit is available upon request and school approval.
