WORLD WINTER GAMES

Washington State members of Team USA competed against some of the best athletes from around the world and took home an impressive number of awards during the 2009 World Winter Games held in Idaho this February. Six of the Washington athletes on Team USA were from the Skihawks Racing team that trains with the Outdoors for All Wednesday and Saturday programs. They competed in Alpine, Nordic and Snowboarding, three of the seven events that attracted 2000 athletes from 100 countries during the 7 days of the Winter World Games.

The 2009 World Winter Games are comparable to the Olympic Winter games but this years events in Idaho included more athletes from more nations than both the 2002 Salt Lake Winter Olympics and the 2006 Torin Winter Olympics.

Team USA members from the Skihawks Racing team included Delight Andresen, Katie Meyer and Ian Dews who competed in Alpine events, Stephanie Sarason and Tim Rainville who competed in Nordic and Craig Daly who competed in Snowboard events. Combined they won a total of two Gold Medals, nine Bronze Medals, four 4th Place awards, and one 5th Place award.

Jenny Fry, an Outdoors for All volunteer and Skihawks Nordic coach was also selected for Team USA as a coach for the Nordic athletes. This is the 3rd time she has coached for Team USA at the World Winter Games.
